School Responsibilities

Crump Elementary will:

Crump Elementary offers research-based curriculum that supports our best instructional practices to improve student achievement. The curriculum in all subject areas is based on clearly defined expectations for student learning. We review assessment results to determine strengths and areas of focus, plan instruction that provides a high quality education for academic success, provide students various opportunities to demonstrate academic success, provide students various opportunities to demonstrate academic excellence, give students timely feedback, and assist students to be lifelong learners.

- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually at Crump Elementary school) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement.** Specifically, those conferences will be held:

Parents are provided the opportunity to conference daily with the teachers. Parents can also meet with teacher by the end of the first month of school. Also, teachers are available for parent conferences by appointment on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, or any mornings before school. We have also set aside every first Friday of each month for parent conferences. Parent-Teacher Conferences are arranged by individual teacher or by calling the office at (334)223-6920. These conferences allow the parent to communicate with the child's teacher about his/her classroom performance and daily assignments. We will also communicate with our families, our high academic standards, student progress, and the school's overall performance. Parent-Teacher Conferences are not held during valuable instructional time. Other staff members or an administrator may be asked to participate in all conferences.

- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.** Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

Various methods are utilized to ensure clear and effective communications among all parents. - 4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff.** Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows: The school provides educational opportunities to assist parents in understanding the various stages of student development. Staff is available each week on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays before and after school and during their planning period by appointment. Teachers are also available the first Friday of each month from 10:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. The administrative staff is available from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday-Friday. and via cell phone after school hours.

- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities,** as follows: As a school, we encourage all families to be involved as much as possible. We ask each parent to volunteer for at least one activity during the school year. Also, we solicit parental support in various areas, such as assisting with morning cafeteria duty, assisting with the afternoon dismissal process, distributing flyers, making copies, monitoring small groups, chaperoning field trips and/or after-school activities, participating with the school's Clean-Up Daily, etc.

- 6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.**
